Cities and Climate Change Initiative (CCCI)

- Launched 2008
- *Goal:* foster sustainable urban climate change compatible development (adaptation & mitigation)
- *How:* support cities and national governments
 - providing assistance and guidance to develop and implement climate and urban related policies and strategies
 - building capacity, awareness & leadership
 - activities: vulnerability assessments, GHG assessment, action plans, CC policy, NUP, LEDS, mainstreaming



Country & City Activities

- *Where:* 42 cities globally, 32 cities in Asia Pacific
- 18 countries in Asia Pacific

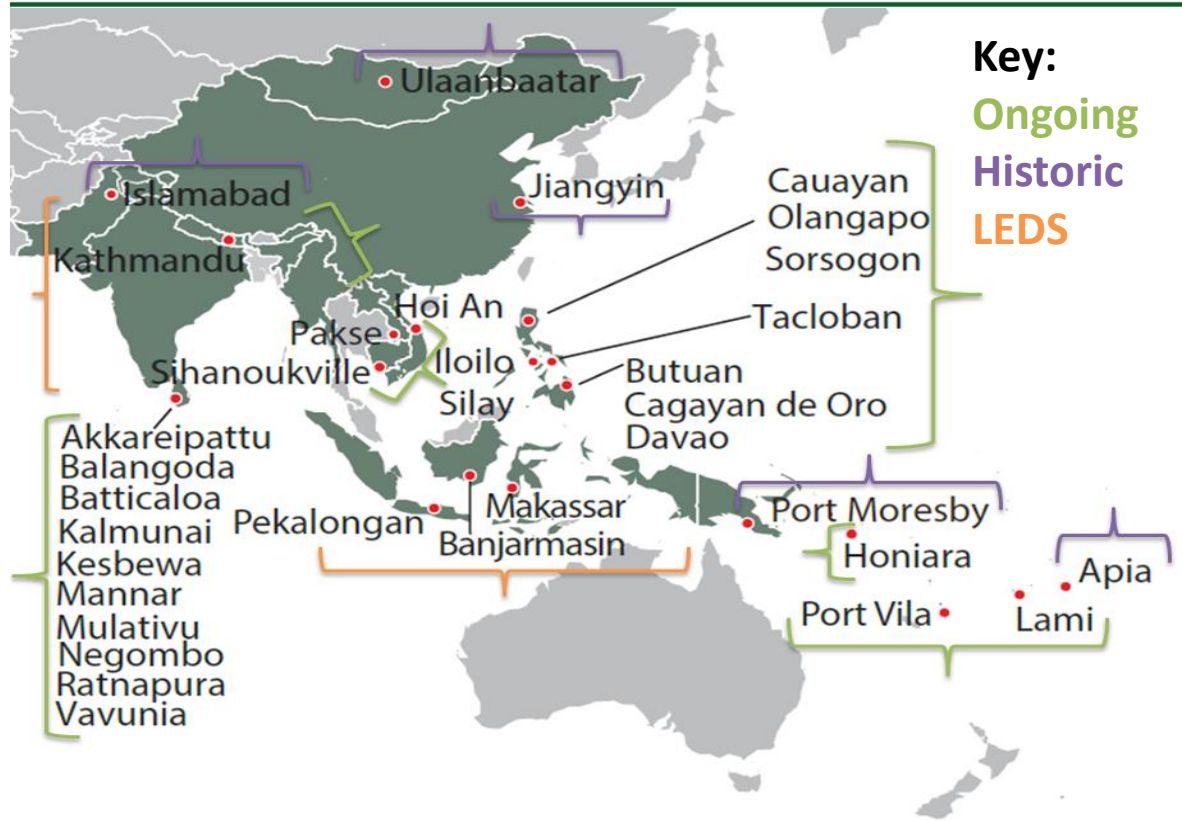

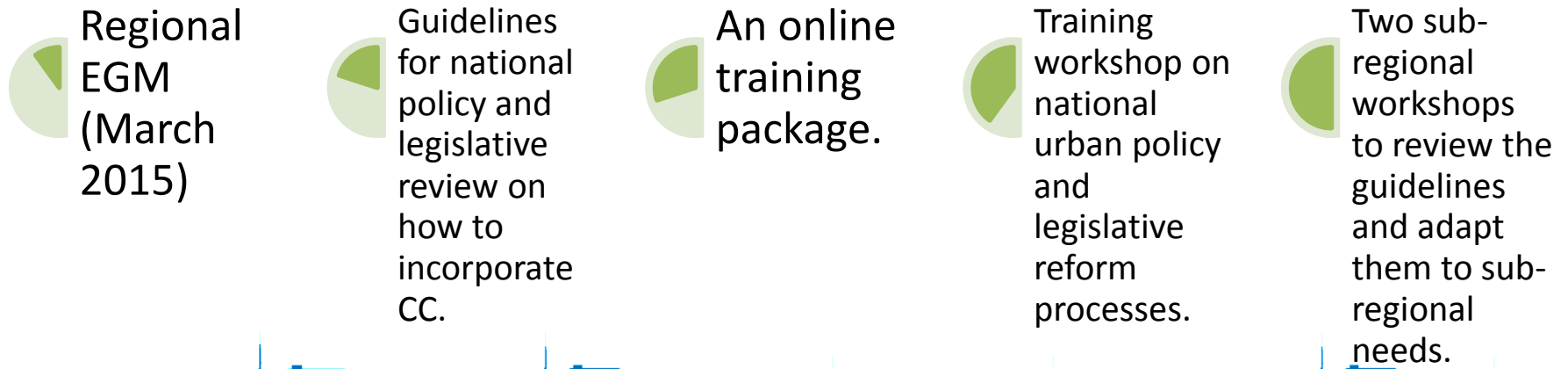
City level action: Sorsogon, Philippines

- multi-hazard exposure (cyclones, flooding, landslides, SLR) & high vulnerability (infra-structure, institutions, knowledge) → high RISK
- participatory VA
- revision of legislation (City Land Use Plan), institutions (Disaster Coordinating Council) & means of implementation on city governance level
- capacity/knowledge/awareness
- encouragement & partnerships
- mitigation

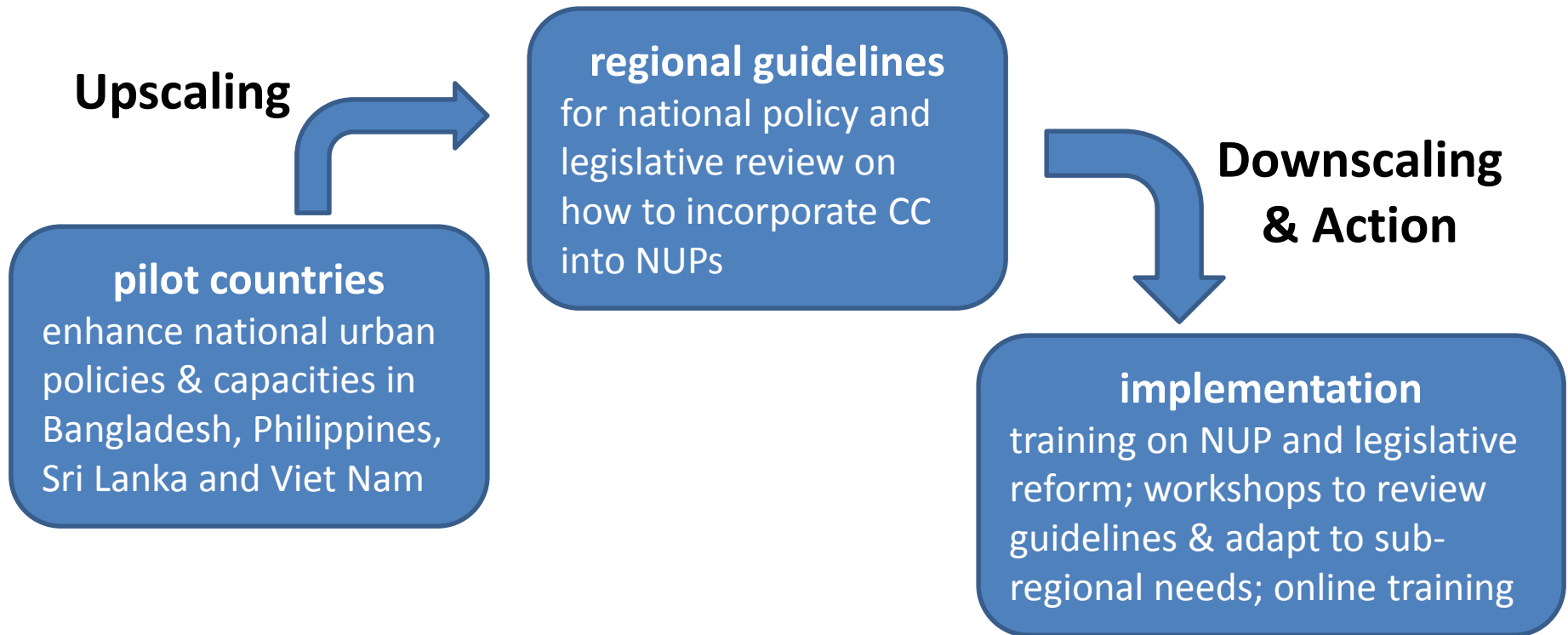


National & regional level: Mainstreaming Climate Change into National Urban Policies

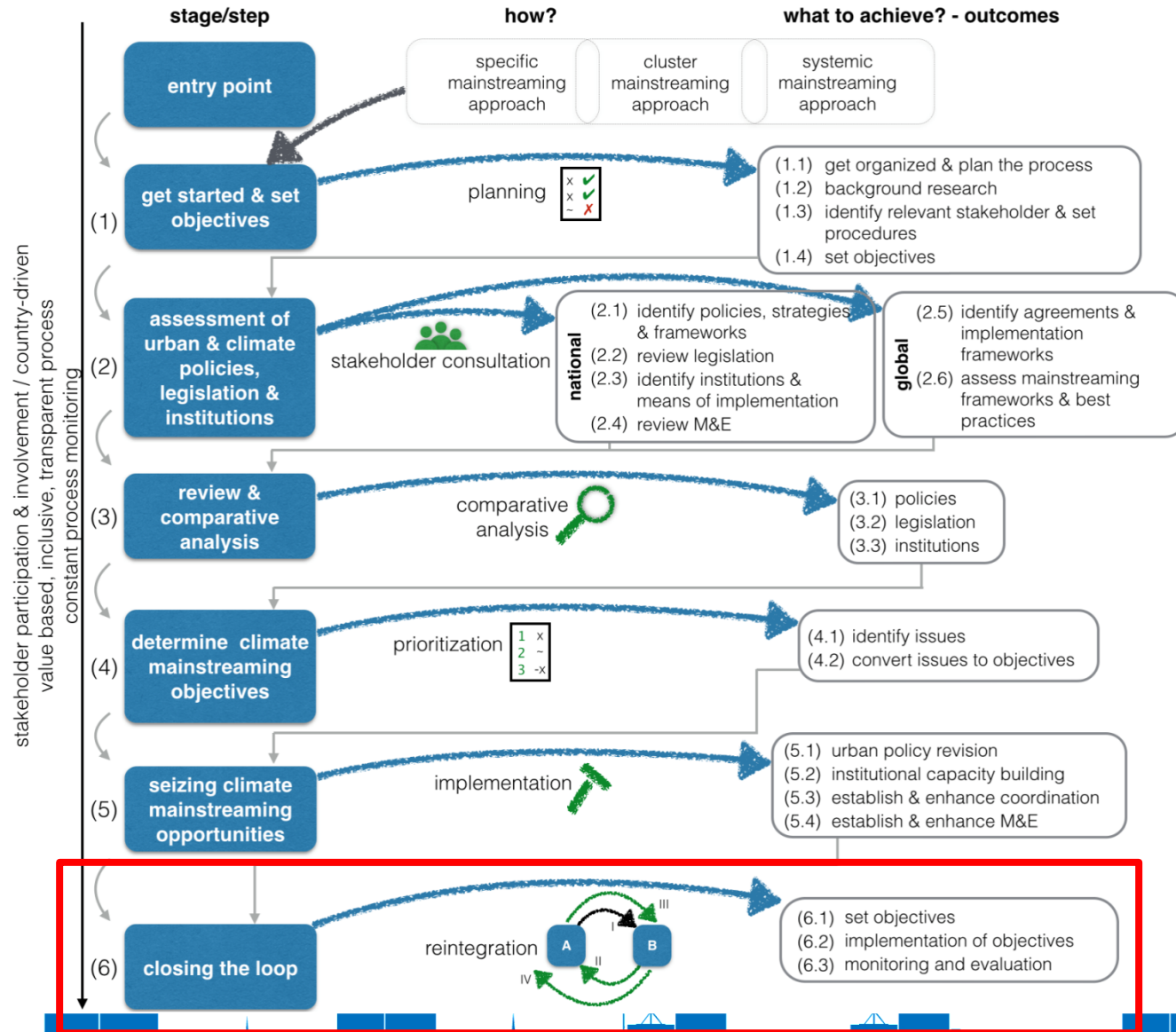
- Launched 2015 by UN Habitat, UN ESCAP & UNEP
- *Background:* address national & global components of CCCI & upcoming global commitments (SDG, Paris, NUA, SFDRR)
- *Goal:* engage urban ministries in CC & foster commitment to address CC component in urban policies

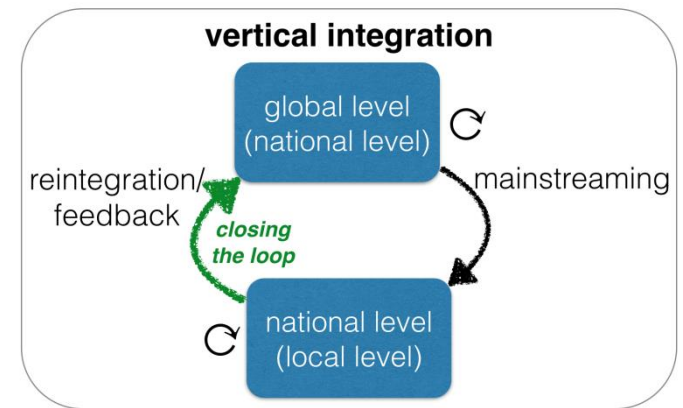
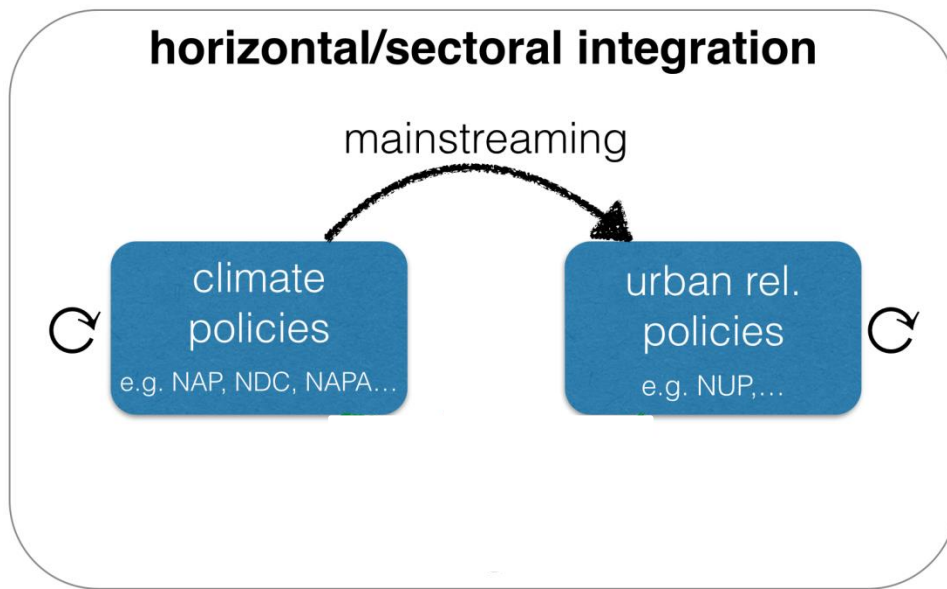

- Step 1: Mainstreaming
 - NUPs that integrate climate change policies



Other dimensions:

- Step 2: Closing the loop
 - NAPs that integrate urban policies
- Vertical
- Space

- Stakeholder

Outlook: NAP-Urb

- National Adaptation Plan Urban Support Programme (NAP-Urb) - Proposal
- following UNDP & FAO's NAP-Agr
- Project objectives:
 - Partner and test the integration of 'urban issues' into NAP development processes
 - Develop 'Urban NAP Guidelines' as a sector-specific product under the NAP-Global Support Programme & NAP Technical Guidelines
 - Support joint proposal development to multi-lateral climate finance institutions for supporting multiple countries with the implementation of city-relevant actions in their NDCs/ NAPs;
 - Act as a feedback mechanism to NUPs
