Goals & Objectives

3 Components

Targeted Topics Forum

- Donors, national policy makers and practitioners discuss challenges and best practices related to the NAP process

Global donor coordination

- Bilateral donors promote/learn about NAP processes, share experiences, and coordinate with each other

In-country coordination

- Technical support to strengthen host country leadership and in-country donor coordination for the NAP process



Results of 1st Targeted Topics Forum

on high-level political support and sectoral integration

July 14, 2015



The Network held its first Targeted Topics Forum (TTF) in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil on July 1-2, 2015 with 28 participants from 14 countries. The event focused on two related topics: securing high-level political support for adaptation planning, and integration of National Adaptation Plan (NAP) processes into key sectors affected by climate change.

These topics reflect objectives and principles of the NAP process, which is intended to facilitate the integration of climate change adaptation into new and existing policies spanning sectors and levels of government, and to align with overall sustainable development priorities. The process therefore requires support and cooperation from a range of actors, including ministries of planning, finance, and climate-sensitive sectors, ministries responsible for climate and environment, as well as development cooperation agencies. Participants in this first TTF included representatives from each of these types of institutions.

Considering factors affecting political support and different approaches to integration, over the two days of the TTF participants discussed challenges, opportunities and lessons from their experiences with and expectations for the NAP process

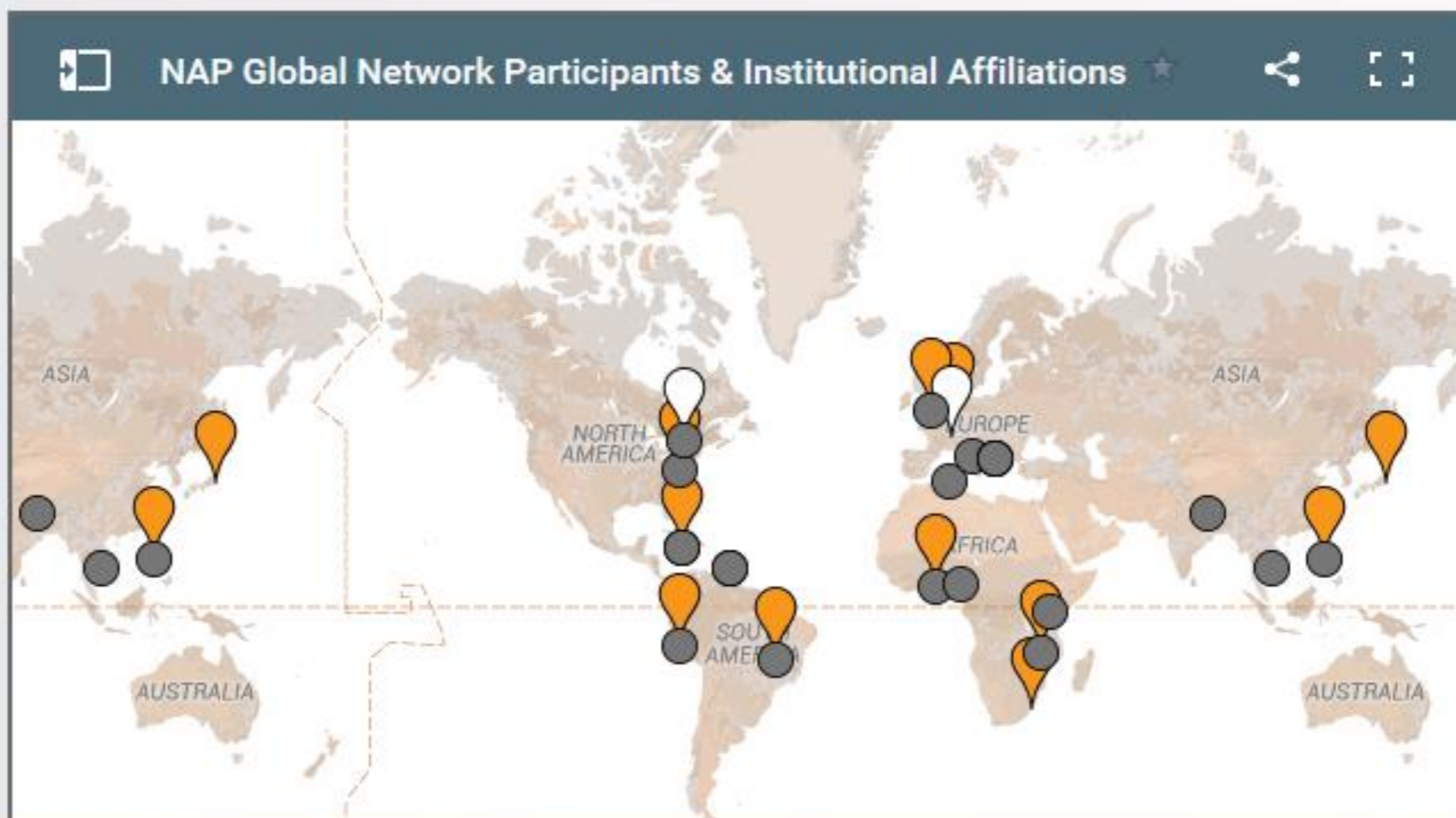
